# NAAA Update

# **Mike Campbell**

NAAA fall board meetings were held October 10-13 in Chattanooga, TN. It was a productive three days in a setting just blocks away from the Tennessee River. I serve on 5 committees. I will briefly highlight activities that NAAA staff and your state representatives are currently working on. The membership committee will eliminate production of the paper directory in 2026. These are produced every spring and are outdated as soon as they are printed as members tend to renew at different times of the year. This could be updated and kept current if digitally produced and would save thousands of dollars each year. At the request of NAAA members, finding solutions for

health and life insurance is an issue NAAA has been working on for several years. The insurance committee has announced that these policies are now available for members. This has been quite an undertaking and is definitely a perk you'll want to explore. The Safety & DAAC Committee wants to obtain real numbers for accidents involving UAS. The UAAS committee is new to NAAA; it will help broaden the message of airspace safety and application efficacy. One key item the group will focus on is right-of-way issues involving UAS and fixed wing and rotor aircraft. The AMAA may want to consider, as other states are doing, inviting UAS operators to Operation SAFE clinics and offering memberships to the state association.

### A couple items of note:

□ Darrin Pluhar is a new board member of NAAREF. Congratulations, Darrin!
□ Toby McPherson, a North Dakota operator and with the help of NAAA, will donate his
Ag Cat Serial #1 to the Smithsonian Museum.

Ag accidents were routinely in the 100's per year in the 1990's but, because of NAAA's award-winning PAASS program, there have been only 52 (13 fatal) in 2024. This number is still way too high! The 2024-25 PAASS message is geared towards aviation safety (CFIT) and environmental professionalism. The staff continues to make great headway with the EPA; since 2017, NAAA has commented on over 280 pesticide reviews. There are continued gains in the area of tower markings. The FAA approved radio frequency 122.925 for communication between ag aircraft. The Farm Bill expired 9/30/24; NAAA has priorities in place for the new bill and will comment soon. Don't expect a new bill to be in place until 2025. Press releases and Ag on the Mall are still a big hit with consumers and the ag community alike. The 2024 Ag Aviation Expo will be held in Dallas/Fort Worth November 16-20, 2024. Having an earlier convention is something members have wanted, and by the record number of pre-registrations members are looking forward to the show in the Lone Star state. can attest to its benefits.

This year I serve on three Support committees that include Convention, ATHENA, and Scholarship, which I chair. The Convention committee is tasked with providing a fun activity during the Ag Expo each year; this year it is in Dallas/Fort Worth November 16-20. On Monday, November 18 th, the ladies (adult only) outing is a short bus ride from the Omni Hotel to Billy Bob's for a southern barbecue buffet followed by an hour-long line dancing class. The class size is limited to 100 ladies so sign up soon (via the convention registration form) if you plan to attend. The 2024-25 ATHENA program is entitled "What is Your Game Plan?" and will be offered on Wednesday morning,

November 20 th from 9:45-11:45. Pre-Game planning is necessary before a busy spray season; this period focuses on what to do ahead of time (purchasing supplies, completing forms, etc.) as well as communication tactics between your pilots, ground crew and family members. The second part of the presentation focuses on Game Time. There will be 8 scenarios offered and discussion will be encouraged on how to handle situations that may arise during your work season. This will be followed by the Post Season wrap-up, with takeaway tips to help guarantee a smooth and successful spray season. Guys and gals alike find the ATHENA program valuable, and many states offer this to everyone during their annual conventions. Finally, the Scholarship committee reviewed 5 applications that we received from students answering the question "What are the biggest obstacles to the ag aviation industry in your area? Discuss how they could be overcome." We have \$3,000 to disperse and this year we chose to give the top three applicants each \$1,000 because of the creativity, knowledge, and love of agriculture revealed in their essays. It was really fun to read how the students express their knowledge and desire to be a part of our great industry. We haven't quite finalized the topic for the 2025 essay but watch for the announcement next spring on the NAAA website and in this newsletter.

The main work of the Legislature, this session, will be:

- 1. Property tax revisions, which AMAA should watch closely
- 2. An Ag exemption to certain acreages, part #1, above
- 3. Clean-up bills from Dept of Ag.
- 4.Lots of water bill drafts
- 4.A local district judge, cleared the way for all paperwork for a bill, as it is being drafted, to remain 'private', until the bill receives a number. So, very hard for anyone, to check on the wording of a bill (its intent), as the bill is being written.

  Sounds like the Montana Supreme Court will be weighing in on the District judges' summer 2024 decision.
- 5. After the November election, more will be known about new bill drafts, some of which, could affect AMAA members. The new members of the Legislature will have 'given away' their intentions, via individual bill drafts.
- 6.All the "usual" bills, of which, some could affect AMAA members. Such as Appropriations bills, nutrient standards, work comp changes, etc.
